## CORD MEYER SUPPORTS THE BAYSIDE HISTORICAL SOCIETY BY FEATURING SUBMISSIONS FROM ART SHOW NOW THROUGH MARCH 10<sup>th</sup> AT THE BAY TERRACE

Several storefronts at The Bay Terrace have been transformed into gallery space after the Bayside Historical Society's 20<sup>th</sup> Annual Winter Art Show was forced to go virtual.

Queens, NY – February 26, 2021...The Bayside Historical Society's Annual Winter Art Show in Fort Totten Park is an eagerly-anticipated community event. Due to pandemic restrictions, this year's 20<sup>th</sup> annual show is being presented virtually through the historical society's website. Always seeking ways to support Bayside-area not-for-profits, Queens developer Cord Meyer approached the historical society and offered to display — and make available for purchase — artwork from the show at its Bay Terrace shopping center. Now through Wednesday, March 10th, submissions by contemporary Queens-based artists participating in the Bayside Historical Society's 20th Annual Winter Art Show may be viewed through the windows of four storefronts along The Bay Terrace's southern shopping corridor.
